Submissions may be edited, delayed, or declined by the Chronicler.



Arts & Science Champion: James Inn Danski

Archery Championship delayed

On Monday, August 26th, we held our annual Shire Picnic. Many thanks to Margery and Alan for hosting us!

Members brought an ample and delicious potluck meal, including some experiments and previews of dishes for the upcoming Autumn Arrows feast.

Traditionally, the Shire Picnic is the venue for our annual Shire Archery Championship, but with heat index temperatures above 100°, we placed our people's welfare first and delayed the competition. **Our Shire Archery Championship will now be held on the first evening of Autumn Arrows: Friday, October 4th at the Shrine Club in Laquey.**

Our Shire Arts & Science championship faced no such difficulty, and the populace elected His Lordship James Inn Danski as this year's champion. His entry was an unexpectedly successful drinking horn, pictured below:



James' winning entry in this year's Shire Arts & Science Competition. His documentation reads: "Drinking Horn (unfinished). Symbols are painted on due to the particularly thin wall structure. Gold plate sealed. Entire work sealed. Inside not clean & sealed."

Other Arts & Science entries included a shield and armor pieces by shire newcomer Magnus and bone needle-holder necklaces by Hildegard; the full table of entries is pictured on page 4.



Julius the Cat also made a play for the Shire Arts & Science title – with himself as the entry – but was disqualified due to not being allowed on the furniture. He did, however, receive due admiration from the populace.

Recipe of the month: Roman Flaminzo

From <u>Apicius: Cookery and Dining in Imperial</u> <u>Rome</u>, translated by Joseph Dommers Vehling

In honor of this year's Autumn Arrows theme, "Medieval Menagerie," we return to Apicius's cookbook from the late Roman empire. Nobles of the past enjoyed not just keeping and looking at exotic animals, but sometimes hunting and eating them. On the other hand, we should also remember that animals which seem like exotic dishes to us may have been common hunting prizes for people in other places and times.

For Flamingo: Scald the flamingo [prior to removing the feathers; also singe the fine feathers and hair], wash and dress it, put it in a pot, add water, salt, dill, and a little vinegar, to be parboiled. Finish cooking with a bunch of leeks and coriander, and add some reduced must to give it color. In the mortar crush pepper, cumin, coriander, laser root, mint, rue, moisten with vinegar, add dates, and the fond of the braised bird, thicken, [strain], cover the bird with the sauce and serve. Parrot is prepared in the same manner.

this moon brought to you by the letter ...



From Her Ladyship Margery of Penrith:

"This is the letter 'sha' from Cyrillic script. Although Cyrillic is still used today to write many modern Eastern European and Central Asian languages, it was originally developed by students of Saints Cyril and Methodius, who lived in the 9th century.

"Many Cyrillic letters were derived from Greek, but this particular one was taken from the Hebrew letter 'shin.' Because of this and other 'borrowings,' Cyrillic has gained the reputation of being the sort of alphabet that beats up other alphabets in dark alleys and goes through their pockets for spare letters."

In late-breaking news, Her Ladyship Margery was recently chosen for elevation to the Order of the Laurel, our Society's highest honor in Arts & Science, in part for her work on access to other-language sources as well as her wider research and accomplishments.
