

The Dancing Moon Inn was open for lunch, coordinated by Hildegard, with dishes volunteered potluck-style by our shire members.

All told, we had 59 attendees, including 2 youth, 35 archers, and 36 feastgoers.

After subtracting expenses, our profit from gate and feast plus proceeds from our Inn and Auction came close to \$1500. With everyone's help, we are well-positioned to meet our expected expenses for the coming year and make a respectable tithe to support the Kingdom.

RECIPE OF THE ISSUE: MUSHROOM & CHEESE TART

A feast dish from Autumn Arrows XXXIII:

- 1 pre-baked pie crust
- 8 ounces sliced white mushrooms
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1/2 cup onion, minced
- 5 large eggs
- 1 1/4 cup heavy cream
- 1/4 cup water

CARC RECIPE (continued)

4 ounces smoked Gouda cheese
1 tablespoon fresh chives
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon black pepper

Preparation: Preheat oven to 375° and place rack to the middle position. Mince the onion. Snip the chives. Grate the cheese.

Method: Heat a sauté pan over medium heat and when hot, add 2 tablespoons butter and the sliced mushrooms and minced onions. Stir to coat. Sauté for two minutes, then stir and sauté 1-2 minutes more or until some of the moisture has been removed from the mushrooms and the onions are softened.

Add the eggs, heavy cream, water, salt and pepper to a medium bowl. Beat at high speed until combined and frothy.

Layer: Add 1/3 of the cheese to the bottom of the pie crust, spreading it so that it is even. Arrange 1/2 of the onion and mushroom mix, and 1/2 of the chives evenly over the cheese. Add another layer of cheese, followed by the rest of the onions, mushrooms and chives. Slowly pour the custard over the ingredients. Top with the remaining cheese.

Bake: Bake for 15 minutes at 375°, then for 15 minutes at 350° or until the top is browned and the middle is just set. It may puff up a bit, and you may need to cover the pie crust edge with foil to prevent over-browning. Baking time may vary based on your oven. Let cool to room temperature before serving or cover (after cooling) and refrigerate until needed.

you by the letter...



This is character G3 of the Byblos script, an ancient writing system that appears on artifacts from the second millennium BCE, mostly from Byblos in present-day Lebanon. Examples have also been found in Egypt, Italy, and Israel.

Byblos script is an undeciphered writing system. Scholars have so far been unable to determine what it means or sounds like.

There are many of these undeciphered scripts, most of them ancient, but some are medieval or even modern. They can be difficult to decipher because there are too few examples, or because they don't seem to be related to other languages which could offer clues. Sometimes it's unclear whether the marks are even writing at all.

In the case of Byblos script, that last question is clear. These characters mean something, but no one alive today knows what.
